



WHAT IS THE BSN PROGRAM?

This program is designed for those students who are seeking a baccalaureate degree and licensure as a registered nurse. This traditional program is three years in length for the nursing course sequence for a total of 69 credit hours. Completion of the prerequisite coursework is required before beginning the nursing program. University Hospitals will be a primary partner for clinical placement. To assist nursing students, University Hospitals offers a limited number of students in the program tuition support (\$12,000) through their Nursing Scholars Program.

HOW IS THE PROGRAM SCHEDULED?

The program requires full-time student status over three years for the nursing course sequence. Nursing classes are scheduled in the fall and spring semesters only. This program begins in January of each year. Classes will be Monday through Friday beginning at 5:00 p.m. and clinical rotations will be on the weekends.

HOW DO I APPLY TO THE SCHOOL OF NURSING?

Begin the admissions process by attending an information session. A schedule may be found on our website. You may also contact the School of Nursing and schedule an appointment with an advisor. Detailed admissions requirements, instructions, and application forms may be also found at csuohio.edu/nursing.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION INCLUDE:

- 1 Apply for admission to CSU. We recommend that this be done at least six weeks prior to any School of Nursing deadlines.
- 2 Complete all prerequisite coursework with a grade of "C" or higher. Maintain an overall prerequisite GPA of at least 3.00.
- 3 Maintain a cumulative GPA of at least 2.75.
- 4 Submit a School of Nursing application packet. Deadline is September 1. Applicants must have successfully completed two of the science prerequisites at the time of application submission.
- 5 Submit two letters of recommendation (included in the application packet) and a current resume with your application.
